Cookies

Some of the pages on this website use cookies. Cookies do not harm your computer and do not contain viruses. We use cookies to make our website more user-friendly, effective and secure. Cookies are small text files that are stored on your computer by your browser. Most of the cookies we use are “session cookies”. This means that they are automatically deleted at the end of your visit. Other cookies are stored on your device until you delete them. These cookies allow us to recognize your browser the next time you visit our website. You can configure your browser to inform you when cookies are stored and to allow cookies only on a case-by-case basis, or to accept cookies in specific cases or disable them completely and to activate automatic cookie deletion when you close your browser. If you deactivate cookies, the functions of this website may be restricted.

Personal data

Simply accessing the Staqual website does not result in the collection of any personal data. We only collect personal data that you make available to Staqual, for example, as part of the newsletter subscription, when completing forms or in relation to other queries. We only collect, process, use and pass on your personal data to the extent that is necessary for us to deal with your request enquiry or if you have given your consent. On request, we will inform you in writing in accordance with the applicable legislation whether and which personal data about you we have stored.

Contact form

If you submit enquiries to us using the contact form provided, we will save your details from the contact form, including your contact details specified therein. This is to allow us to process your request and in case there are follow-up questions. We will not pass on this data without your consent.

YouTube

Our website uses plug-ins for the YouTube website operated by Google. The website operator is YouTube, LLC, 901 Cherry Ave., San Bruno, CA 94066, USA. If you visit pages on our website equipped with a YouTube plug-in, a connection to the servers of YouTube is set up. The YouTube server is notified about which of our web pages you visited.

If you are logged into your YouTube account, this enables YouTube to associate your surfing behavior directly to your personal profile. You can prevent this by logging out of your YouTube account beforehand.
